Company Overview:

Exclusively Alaska for over 40 years, Alaska Wildland Adventures (AWA) features a wide range of ways to experience the Last Frontier. AWA's three wilderness lodges - Kenai Riverside Lodge, Kenai Backcountry Lodge and Kenai Fjords Glacier Lodge - are the featured lodges in a wide selection of all-inclusive Alaska Adventures, Lodge and Fishing packages. The company is well recognized for operating some of the most highly regarded small group tours and lodges on the Kenai Peninsula and in the Denali National Park area. Since AWA's founding in 1977, the company has attracted travelers looking to go a step beyond the standard cruise or motorcoach tour. AWA holds fast to its core principle that Alaska is best experienced personally and respectfully, in a style that recognizes the true value of the wilderness. Alaska Wildland Adventures' trips focus on small group experiences (usually 12-18 people) that seamlessly combine fun outdoor adventuring with remote backcountry lodging, delicious meals and friendly, professional guides. Special family itineraries are offered.

All-Inclusive Alaska Adventures:

AWA's [Alaska Adventures](#) are all-inclusive, small group tours which feature fully guided hiking, rafting, kayaking and relaxing at wilderness lodges on the Kenai Peninsula and in Denali National Park. Itineraries run during the summer season (June through mid-September) and range from seven to twelve days in length. Lodging, transportation, equipment and most dining are included.

Lodge Stays and Lodge-to-Lodge Packages:

AWA offers individual stays at all three of the company's [wilderness lodges](#) and can customize lodge-to-lodge combination trips for guests seeking a truly one-of-a-kind itinerary. All packages are all-inclusive and lodge links may be used to add round-trip transportation to/from Anchorage as desired. The lodges feature the perfect balance of rustically modern and private cabins, delicious and locally-sourced food, immersive activity choices, and locations that introduce visitors to the real, authentic Alaska.

The Lodges:

Kenai Riverside Lodge: AWA's original [log lodge](#) and cabins in Cooper Landing, surrounded by snowcapped mountains and located right on the banks of the upper Kenai River. Kenai Riverside Lodge also acts as the homebase for the Kenai Riverside Fishing program and Kenai River Day Trips.

Kenai Backcountry Lodge: An authentic Alaskan wilderness experience at a historic and ecologically managed [log lodge](#) surrounded by one million acres of designated wilderness in Kenai National Wildlife Refuge.

Kenai Fjords Glacier Lodge: AWA's newest [wilderness lodge](#), this seacoast paradise is surrounded by the stunning seacoast of Kenai Fjords National Park and is the only lodge located within the park.

Guided Fishing:

[Kenai Riverside Fishing](#) is a long-time operator of guided fishing trips, since 1977. These all-inclusive trips offers guests great opportunities to fish the world-famous Kenai River for freshwater species, like silver salmon, sockeye salmon, rainbow trout and Dolly Varden. The program also fishes Resurrection Bay for halibut, king salmon and silver salmon. With friendly, knowledgeable guides and flexible itineraries and activities, these trips are once-in-a-lifetime fishing adventures.

Rafting and Fishing Day Trips:

[Kenai River Trips](#) offers guests unbeatable rafting and fishing day trip adventures on the Kenai River. Rafting trips include the two-hour Kenai River Scenic Float and the full-day Kenai Canyon Raft Trip featuring sections of Class II+ whitewater. Visitors looking to add a day of fishing for salmon and rainbow trout will find experienced guides, gear and equipment ready to get guests on the water and on the fish.

The Homes at Kenai Riverside Lodge:

A [new accommodation option](#) near Kenai Riverside Lodge features nine gorgeous acres on the banks of the Kenai River. Two identical timber frame houses and a smaller cottage feature thoughtfully designed interior and exterior spaces, perfect for relaxation after a day exploring the Kenai Peninsula. Incredible beam work, wrought-iron flourishes and upscale finishes offer extra comfort and style for guests who wish to stay in these accommodations during their visit to Kenai Riverside Lodge.

Weather Permitting:

[Weather Permitting](#) provides water taxi services, kayak shuttle services, freight hauling, recovery services, film equipment platform and kayak day trips in and around Seward and Kenai Fjords National Park. The boats are designed to provide the smoothest ride possible, keeping kayakers, gear and freight secure and passengers comfortable in seas of any kind. Weather Permitting also provides transportation to Kenai Fjords Glacier Lodge.

Meals:

Most all meals and snacks are included with every AWA Alaska Adventure, Lodge Package and Fishing package. Meals are hearty, healthy, home-cooked and delicious. With advance notice, special diets are happily accommodated.

Getting There and Around:

Alaska Wildland Adventures' trips and Lodge packages start in Anchorage or Fairbanks. Call our experienced reservations specialists for details on each trip. During an AWA adventure, guests may

travel by raft, touring kayak, foot, cruise yacht, deluxe 20-passenger mini-bus, 15-passenger van and the Alaska Railroad.

Age/ Fitness Requirements:

Average physical condition is all that is needed to enjoy an AWA Adventure or Lodge Package. Participants should be comfortable walking 3-4 hours steadily with short breaks. Family trips cater to families with children between the ages of 6-12. Other AWA trips require that guests be at least twelve years of age.

Climate:

June - September, day temperatures average 60-75°F; night temperatures average 40-60°F. Occasional light rain can be expected, though sunny days generally prevail.
